- 1. Regular Meeting called to order at 7:33 p.m.

- 4. Approval of Minutes:

 - Dog Park/Great Oak Park Update:
 - o Chairman Lee Haymon added that the Roots for Rivers Planting took place recently at Great Oak Park, along with the Environmental Commissions cleanup event. • Team Up to Clean Up 2021 – Logistics and Planning:

• ANJEC Grant Program Project Selection and Approval:

o The Borough submitted the ANJEC Grant for the GIS Mapping in Great Oak Park. Notification of award is coming in June 2021. The application amount is for \$1,500.00. The Commission needs to get on hand the existing GIS files. The Natural Resource Inventory (ROSI) was updated in 2020 by the Borough. Michael Miner suggested engaging volunteers to assist with the software application. Karen Lanza suggested college students and will help reach out to the local colleges. Karen Lanza will draft a communication to send to Ramapo College and William Paterson University.

• Roosevelt Riverfront Park:

o The Borough held a project kickoff meeting for the Roosevelt Riverfront Park Project. The plan is to develop trails, an ADA fishing deck, and flora and fauna signage. Bioswales and permeable pavers are planned too. Chairman Lee Haymon suggested a site walkthrough by the Commission members. The walk through will be May 15, 2021 at 9:00 p.m. at Truman Field. Michael Carelli suggested the Commission members walk through the Pompton Lakes South End Trails for some ideas about the Borough's new project. The site is off of Dawes Highway in Pompton Lakes Borough. Erich Kamm agreed that public input is important when planning a project of this size. The project will be executed in 2022. The grant deadline is 2023. Michael Carelli also added that there is a project in the works for Truman Field sod and netting. Michael Miner will meet

with Karen Lanza separately as both are not available for the walkthrough on 5/15.

 Chairman Lee Haymon asked the Commission for their ideas about the Oakland Carnival. Commission members were asked to bring back ideas at the June Meeting so the Commission can start planning the table.
