ROLL CALL: Mayor Schwager called the meeting to order and the Clerk called the roll. Present: Mayor Schwager, Councilmembers Biale, Knapp, Kulmala, Levy, Talamini. Absent: Councilwoman Coira. Also Present: Lisa M. Duncan, Borough Clerk; Brian Chewcaskie, Borough Attorney.

SALUTE TO THE FLAG:

MOMENT OF SILENCE:

MEETING ANNOUNCEMENT: Mayor Schwager announced this meeting is being held in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Law duly announced and included in the schedule of regular meetings.

MOTION TO EXCUSE ABSENCE:

On motion of Councilman Biale, seconded by Councilman Kulmala, the absence of Councilwoman Coira be excused.

ROLL CALL: All yeas, Councilmembers Biale, Knapp, Kulmala, Levy, Talamini.

MAYOR'S REPORT:

Mayor Schwager advised that she and Mr. Kunze met with the Ramapo River Reserve Board members and Attorney. They have issues with the roads and signage. She understands the need for the yellow line down Ramapo River Trace and that will be made a priority. Mayor Schwager will have the Traffic Officer check the signs. She advised that regular meetings will be held with the Board. Mayor Schwager received notification from Congressman Gottheimer that Mike Guadagnino is receiving the hometown hero award for Oakland.

APPOINTMENT OF FIRE FIGHTER:

Mayor Schwager administered the Oath of Office to Peter J. Rocco as a firefighter for the Oakland Volunteer Fire Department.

Dave Richardson, 320 Ramapo Valley Road, spoke of the danger at the intersection of West Oakland Avenue and Ramapo Valley Road. He commented that the garbage can outside of Starbucks is not being emptied. Mayor Schwager advised that the Property Maintenance Officer will look into this. Mr. Richardson asked why the lights are on at the kid playground until 10:00 pm when no one is going to use the playground. Councilman Kulmala explained that when soccer was in season at night, the lights would just shut off and there was no light for egress to the parking lot. The lights by the playground were put on for that safety issue.

Don Burns, 22 Whittier Lane, read an email he sent to the Mayor and Council expressing his dissatisfaction with their decision to move to twice per week garbage pick up. Mayor Schwager explained that she got phone calls and people coming in to her office saying they wanted twice per week pick up.

The Clerk then read by title an Ordinance entitled "BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE MAKING OF VARIOUS PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS AND THE ACQUISITION OF NEW COMMUNICATION AND SIGNAL SYSTEMS EQUIPMENT IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF OAKLAND, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$2,690,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS."

ROLL CALL: All yeas, Councilmembers Biale, Knapp, Kulmala, Levy, Talamini.

No comments made.

CLOSED FOR PUBLIC DISCUSSION:

On motion of Councilman Biale, seconded by Councilman Levy, this portion of the meeting be closed to public discussion.

ROLL CALL: All yeas, Councilmembers Biale, Knapp, Kulmala, Levy, Talamini.

Councilman Kulmala commented that he needs clarification. He is concerned with the amount of \$400,000 for the Fire Department garage. He commented that the amount is 25% of the Library project. He asked what the use is, what the square footage will be, and how it will be constructed. Councilman Knapp responded that \$400,000 is double the amount that is actually needed. Mr. Kunze had increased the number for soft costs. If the money is not used, it can be canceled. He explained it is for a three-bay garage. One bay is for the Suburban, one bay is for storage of the boat, and one bay is for the OEM truck. Councilman Kulmala asked how many square feet the garage will be. Councilman Knapp responded it was going to be 24x40 or 960 square feet. Councilman Kulmala asked if anyone solicited bids. Assistant Fire Chief Dies advised that three companies gave quotes. The quotes received were between \$72,000 and \$100,000. However, prevailing wage drives the cost up.

MOTION TO TABLE:

On motion of Councilman Kulmala, seconded by Councilman Talamini, the adoption of Ordinance 17-Bond-761 be tabled.

Councilman Knapp explained that the Fire Department did not ask for that amount. That number was put in by the Borough Administrator as a safety net. He does think the entire amount will be spent. Borough Engineer Rebecca Mejia advised that a meeting was held on October 4th regarding the garage. She explained that the building needed to be heated, there needs to be a fire suppression system, drainage, plumbing and a gutter system. She came up with the estimate based on a similar project done in another municipality. Councilman Kulmala asked about the scope of the project. He would like a presentation done by the Fire Chief and the Borough Engineer at the next meeting. Mayor Schwager asked why this was not brought up when the ordinance was introduced. Mr. Chewcaskie advised that this bond ordinance is an authorization to borrow money. The actual expenditure of the project would be authorized separately by the Governing Body. The bond ordinance requires an affirmative vote of 2/3 of the Governing Body. He reiterated that the ordinance is merely an authorization not a vote on an expenditure and the amounts in the bond ordinance are based on estimates. The Borough Engineer advised that the Council can change the scope of the project if needed. Mr. Chewcaskie advised that if this ordinance is not adopted tonight, it would need to be reintroduced next year and may hold up other Department's projects.
