RESOLUTION 17-255 AUTHORIZE BID FOR CELL TOWER

On motion of Councilman Biale, seconded by Councilman Knapp, the following resolution be introduced, adopted and duly passed by roll call vote:

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Oakland desire to authorize the solicitation of bids for construction of a 150 foot wireless telecommunications monopole and related support facilities on a portion of Borough owned Property known as Block 1902, Lot 1, Oakland, New Jersey (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, the successful bidder shall enter into a lease with the Borough to lease a 600 square foot portion of the Property in order to construct said monopole and rent shall be due and payable to the Borough under the terms of said Lease; and

WHEREAS, the monopole and related support facilities shall be constructed at the sole cost and expense of the successful bidder and the Borough shall have the right to re-locate its antennas to said monopole once constructed; and

WHEREAS, the successful bidder is required to undergo a Capital Projects Review before the Planning Board pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:55D-31 and to obtain any and all governmental licenses, permits, approvals, or other relief required of or deemed necessary or appropriate by bidder for its use of the property for a wireless telecommunications facility; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the Borough of Oakland to advertise for bids for the construction of a wireless telecommunications monopole on Borough owned Property.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Oakland, State of New Jersey, that the Borough Administrator be and he is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids for lease of a portion of municipally owned property known as Block 1902, Lot 1, to permit the construction of a 150 foot wireless telecommunications monopole.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the advertisement for such bidding shall be published in the Borough's official newspaper.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all bids shall be received by the Borough Administrator by Tuesday October 17, 2017 at 11:00 am.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Borough reserves the right to reject all bids.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this resolution shall be provided to the Committee members and shall be kept on file in the Office of the Borough Clerk.

RESOLUTION 17-256 AUTHORIZE RETIREMENT PAYOUT-D. MORGAN

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 5:30-15 establishes rules that govern how local government units manage and finance compensation for accumulated absence time for their respective employees, and

WHEREAS, accumulated absence includes any sick days, vacation days, personal days, compensatory time or any other absence time authorized as part of an employer agreement, which is not used by the employee during the allowed period and which is permitted to accumulate over time to the benefit of the employee, and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer has certified that the funds and authority exists to pay the part of the accumulated absence, as per the attached schedule, to Donald Morgan for sick, vacation, personal and compensatory time accumulated in the amount of \$35,581.07; and

WHEREAS, the attached certification and documentation are presented to comply with the rules and regulations established by the Local Finance Board.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Oakland that the total sum \$ 35,581.07 composed of 195 hours of vacation time, 600 hours of sick time, and 16 hours of personal time be paid out to Donald Morgan. WHEREAS, an application has been made to the Borough of Oakland by the CTC Academy for the modification and expansion of the wastewater treatment system for the facility located at 125 Bauer Drive.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Oakland as follows:

The Mayor is hereby authorized to execute the necessary consent by Governing Body to be attached to the Treatment Works Application to be filed by CTC Academy subject to the following:

- A. The construction shall conform to all applicable requirements of the Borough of Oakland and the Board of Health of the Borough of Oakland.
- B. The installation of all sewer lines and appurtenances shall be inspected and approved by the Borough of Oakland and/or the Borough of Oakland Board of Health.
- C. CTC Academy shall pay for all engineering expenses incurred by the Oakland Board of Health and the Borough of Oakland for all inspections and testing of the sewer lines and/or appurtenances.

D. CTC Academy shall pay for the Borough's application fees, legal fees and other applications, administrative, technical or any other expenses relating to review of the project.

- E. Any manholes constructed or modified by reason of this project be fitted with sewer guards to prevent inflow. All manholes constructed must be installed with all required waterproofing measures, including exterior painting and pipe gasket interlock.
- F. Water conserving plumbing fixtures be installed in all new buildings constructed as part of this project.
- G. CTC Academy shall comply with all conditions imposed by the Oakland Board of Health.
- H. CTC Academy shall comply with all rules and regulations of the Borough of Oakland, the Oakland Board of Health and the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this Resolution shall be provided to CTC Academy and the Oakland Board of Health.

On motion of Councilman Biale, seconded by Councilman Knapp, the following resolution be introduced, adopted and duly passed by roll call vote:

WHEREAS, the Police Chief has requested the appointment of Per Diem Dispatchers and has completed all necessary background investigations and deemed the candidates to be qualified;

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council hereby appoints Michael Ciccone, Nicholas Marcheso and Dawn Gioia as Per Diem Dispatchers at a salary of \$16.24 per hour effective September 14, 2017.

ROLL CALL: All yeas, Councilmembers Biale, Coira, Knapp.

WORK SESSION:

2017 CAPITAL BUDGET:

Mr. Kunze explained that we need to move forward with the 2017 capital program and adopt the necessary ordinances. We have already discussed capital requests during the budget hearings. However, there are some changes. The amount for computers has increased from \$ 12,500 to \$ 33,000. A new item of equipment for \$ 4,000 has been requested for Swift Water rescue. The amount for Streets & Roads has increased from \$ 1,080,000 to \$ 1,200,000. This will give us flexibility to use as authorization for the Patriot's Way bridge repairs if we are successful in receiving the DOT grant. The supplemental funding request for the Senior Center sprinkler system repairs has been withdrawn pending further discussion on the project scope. The amount for storm sewer repairs has increased from \$ 60,000 to \$ 90,000 based on upcoming projects.

Mr. Kunze advised that we need to start addressing the replacement of water mains in a systematic way. The amount of \$250,000 is a placeholder pending further discussion with the Water & Sewer Committee. There is a \$30,000 request to replace the electrical systems of the Spear Street and Andrew water tanks. Mr. Kunze spoke about rehabilitation of the Sewer treatment plants. The full cost to rehabilitate our three plants is approximately \$4 million. The amount included in the capital budget, \$1,020,000, would be enough to rehabilitate one plant or to run an interconnection to the NWBCUA pump station in Franklin Lakes. That option is being explored by the Borough Engineer.

Mr. Kunze explained that the Library renovation and Senior Center air conditioner have already been funded. Councilman Biale commented that the Borough has been asked to clean stormwater areas where there is tremendous debris. He believes there should be a master plan or policy on how to move forward to address the issues of maintenance. Mr. Kunze explained that in the past, the easements have given us the right to go on the property to maintain. He explained that we have not done any bank stablilization. Councilman Knapp asked if we need permits. Mr. Kunze explained that permits are needed in some situations.

Councilman Knapp advised that the Fire Department is looking to construct a 3 bay garage in the back of the Yawpo Firehouse. They are lacking space for storage of documents, the equipment used for drills and the Suburban vehicle and the OEM vehicle. He explained that the Fire Department also wants to get a generator for both Fire houses. Mayor Schwager asked what the cost would be. Councilman Knapp responded it will cost between \$80,000 and \$90,000 without soft costs. Mr. Kunze advised that we already have some money set aside. Councilwoman Coira advised that she supports the needs of the Fire Department. She questioned the plans to enlarge Company 2 fire house. Mr. Kunze advised the bid has been awarded and the project should begin any day.

Councilwoman Coira advised that the bathrooms at the Recreation field by the old DPW garage need to be renovated. Mr. Kunze advised that he would need to have an estimated amount to put in the ordinance. Councilman Knapp would like to develop a proactive building maintenance plan. Mr. Kunze responded he is looking to get an ordinance in place.

COUNCIL REPORTS:

Councilman Knapp: No report.

Councilwoman Coira: No report.

Councilman Biale: He commented that the Seniors are upset they don't get to see our reports televised. Mayor Schwager asked for an update on the Council chambers. Mr. Kunze responded that the lab is still processing the VOC results. They wanted a fee of \$ 6,000 to expedite the results. Councilman Biale asked if someone from the OCC can videotape the meeting if we have to meet at the Senior Center again.
