WORK SESSION

SHADE TREE LOGO CONTEST:

Councilman Levy advised that the Shade Tree Commission narrowed the choices to four. Discussion ensued over the various designs. The Council all consented to one design but they questioned whether all the details would be visible when the logo was shrunk down and put on letterhead. The Shade Tree Commission will see if they can shrink the logo.

REPLACE LADDER TRUCK:

Mr. Kunze explained that we are ready to order the ladder truck to replace the 2000 ladder truck currently in service. He explained we are using a national co-op to procure the truck at a cost of \$ 1.198 million which is within the amount of funding in place. A mandatory notice advising of the use of the national co-op has been placed in the paper and a resolution will be listed on the next agenda. Delivery will take between 210 and 270 days. Councilman Pignatelli commented that it is great that money was put aside each year so there is no real tax impact.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mayor Schwager advised she was approached by some residents who would like to do a modified version of Station Park. Councilman Levy explained that the residents want to construct a pocket park. He hopes there will be another grant round so we can do the entire park. This pocket park will start to make the area look nice. Mayor Schwager advised the residents are willing to put up a substantial amount of money. She thanked Mike Rose and Chopper Russo. She will set up a Station Park Ad-hoc committee. Councilman Levy advised all labor is going to be donated.

Mayor Schwager advised that the Borough is asking for donations for the Welcome to Oakland signs. Each sign will cost \$ 1,500.

COUNCIL REPORTS:

Councilman Talamini: The OCC thanks Michael Carelli for all his work on the Borough calendar. Volunteers are needed for the television and newsletter committees. The next meeting will be March 2nd at 7:30 pm. The Finance Committee will meet January 30th at 5:30 pm. Councilman Talamini missed the last Library Board meeting but the next meeting is February 13th.

Councilman Biale: The Senior line dancing class will take place Friday January 24th at 2 pm. There will be a presentation from the ShopRite nutritionist on January 30th at 12 pm. The weekly Monday movie for January 27th will be Moneyball. There will be a presentation on February 6th on How to Protect Assets. The casino trip was rescheduled to March 13th. There will be a presentation on March 5th by the County Clerk. The DPW is collecting Christmas trees until January 31st. The DPW Superintendent has been in touch with Rockland Electric over issues with the LED lights. The DPW is asking residents to place trash cans behind the curb line when snow is predicted. The DPW began their pothole repair program. They asked residents to report pothole locations. Since January 2nd, 180 potholes have been repaired. Councilman Biale spoke of an issue with a storm drain at Calumet Ave. The DPW had a crew there after 5 pm and the next day had the NWBCUA there. There was a log in the storm drain. Councilman Biale thanked the DPW for all they do.

Councilman Pignatelli: He attended the Board of Health meeting. He gave deepest thanks to Mary Ann West who served for 21 years and gave valuable insight to the Board of Health. She will be sorely missed. The Board of Health elected Stephen Tiffinger as President and Brian LaForgia as Vice President. There was no Green team meeting and no Environmental Commission meeting this month due to lack of quorum. The Styrofoam collection is for bulk Styrofoam only not food containers, packing peanuts or cups. He advised residents not to dump on the ground if the dumpsters are full. The wind blows it all on other people's property. Councilman Pignatelli thanked the First Aid Squad who just held their installation dinner. They thanked the reisdents for their support. The First Aid Squad is ordering a new ambulance which costs \$ 240,000. They responded to over 900 calls last year.

Councilman Levy: There will be a meeting on February 6th at 5:30 pm to discuss the Skyview treatment plant issues. The Borough will be installing a charcoal filtering device to eliminate odor problems. The Capital Projects Committee is putting together an alternate assessment of Patriot's Way Bridge because we don't agree with the State's findings. Borough engineer John Yakimik advised that this assessment will determine the most prudent way to rehabilitate the Bridge. Councilman Levy advised this is a major priority for this year. The Shade Tree logo contest came up with four designs that the Mayor and Council reviewed tonight. The Flood Commission will work with the CRS coordinator to maintain and increase the CRS Rating. Councilman Levy advised that people are cutting trees along the river and letting them fall in the river. The trees can be dangerous if they reach the flood gates.

Councilman Knapp: The Police did the Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over program from December 6th to 21st. They arrested ten impaired drivers. On December 20th, two recruits graduated from the Academy. No Shave November turned into Double Down December. The Police Department donated \$4,600 to the John Thayer Cancer Center in Hackensack. There were 449 motor vehicle details, 19 radar details, 8 traffic enforcement details and 690 summonses issued in December. The Police responded to 69 ambulance calls and 64 motor vehicle crashes. The Fire Department had 48 calls for 2,765 hours. For the year, the Fire Department had 390 calls and 11,845 hours. The First Aid Squad responded to 69 calls for 138 hours. For the year, they responded to 903 calls and donated 15,446 hours. Councilman Pignatelli advised that these volunteers leave their families to help others.

Mayor Schwager advised that Recreation baseball, softball and volleyball signups are ongoing. She advised residents not to miss the registration date or there will be a late fee. There will be a new lacrosse program for kindergarten through 2nd graders. Registration begins February 1st. The Recreation Commission will meet Monday January 27th at 7:30 pm for their Reorganization and 8:00 pm for the Regular meering.
