WORK SESSION:

REVALUATION ORDER:

Borough Tax Assessor Scott Holzhauer was in attendance to discuss the County's Revaluation Order for Oakland. He has worked in Oakland since 1986. Oakland has received an order from the County Board of Taxation to do a full-scale revaluation. It has been ten years since the last revaluation. The town's ratio (assessment to sale price) is below 85%. Mr. Holzhauer though we would get the order a year ago. Most residentials are selling at 70%.

Mr. Holzhauer would like to request the County change the revaluation order to a reassessment and properties would be reassessed for five years. He would like the Governing Body's support to go to the County. A revaluation is expensive and the tax maps need to be recertified. The cost of a revaluation would be around \$600,000. The initial cost for a reassessment would be \$250,000 and each subsequent year would be between \$50,000-60,000. Mr. Holzhauer advised that a revaluation was done in 1986 for implementation in 1987 and then the market crashed and there was a decline in property values. In 1994, values had to be readjusted. The last revaluation was done in 2004 and implemented in 2005 and then the recession hit in 2007. There was a high volume of appeals so in 2011 a reassessment was done.

.

Mayor Schwager asked the timeframe. Mr. Holzhauer advised that the process would take 8 to 10 months and we won't be likely to implement the revaluation by October as the order states. For the reassessment, we will make two attempts to inspect the property followed by a letter. Mr. Kunze advised that the State does let the municipality do a five-year special emergency to pay for this. The secondary benefit would be that there would not be as many appeals. Councilman

Knapp asked what happens after the rolling program ends. Mr. Holzhauer stated there would be an option to renew. It gives the municipality leverage in appeals.

MOTION TO AUTHORIZE:

On motion of Councilman Knapp, seconded by Councilman Pignatelli, the Governing Body authorizes Borough Tax Assessor Scott Holzhauer to request the County Tax Board to allow Oakland to do a reassessement instead of a revaluation.

ROLL CALL: All yeas, Councilmembers Biale, Knapp, Levy, Pignatelli, Van Eck.

Mayor Schwager asked what happens if we ignore the County order. Mr. Holzhauer responded that the County has the authority to do the revaluation and bill the town.

AMEND ZONING ORDINANCE:

Discussion of this item is held since the ordinance on short term rentals was tabled.

NEW BUSINESS:

Councilman Van Eck advised that there are two Mayors that do not have portraits hanging on the wall and he thinks they should be put up.

OLD BUSINESS:

Councilman Levy spoke about the reason the resolution for the Alternate Analysis for Patriots Bridge was pulled. He explained that he reached out to Assemblyman Auth who took introduced him to the Commissioner of the DOT. There might be options to get the bridge done.

Councilman Pignatelli asked about the status of the traffic study. It is imperative to get this done before Ramapo Valley Road is repaved in case there needs to be changes to the striping in order to help traffic flow. Borough Engineer John Yakimik advised he left a message for the County to check the status of the traffic study. Councilman Pignatelli stated that I287 had a tremendous impact on traffic. He hopes the traffic study is done form Franklin Avenue to Oak Street. He is hoping the data will prove to the State that 287 is the cause of the traffic problems. Councilman Levy spoke about the bypass. He explained that we need to get the traffic count. Once the traffic count is done, we can have an analysis done. Mr. Yakimk advised that he will do an analysis to see where the high volume is and see if striping makes sense. Councilman Pignatelli asked if we can increase the time of the traffic lights during peak time. Mr. Yakimik responded that the priority is to get cars of the exit ramp. There is a conflict between the State and County for the traffic lights. Councilman Biale advised that the State Engineer came in 2013 to try to regulate the signals. He believes this traffic study should be compared to pre-287.

COUNCIL REPORTS:

Councilman Knapp: During the month of January, the Police Department had 427 motor vehicle stops; 24 radar details and 7 traffic enforcement details which resulted in 538 summonses. There were 72 school checks, 44 burglar alarms and 36 motor vehicle crashes. The First Aid Squad had 62 calls in January for 124 hours. The Fire Department responded to 20 calls for 170 hours, 186 hours including training. There was a Great Oak Park Committee meeting last night. The Swords to Plowshares statue will start construction in March. The entrance road behind Portobello's will be paved in 2020. The Dog Park plans will be presented to the Environmental Commission next week and hopefully will be on the March 25th agenda for Mayor and Council approval. The Great Oak lawn is in progress. Mr. Yakimik will have the proposal for the Bandshell at the next meeting.

Councilman Levy: The Shade Tree Commission will meet the first Monday of the month at Borough Hall. The Flood Commission will meet the second Monday of the month at Borough Hall.

Councilman Pignatelli: The BCUA Hazardous Waste dates are March 7th in Moonachie; April 5th at Bergen Community College and May 9th at Campgaw in Mahwah. The hours are 9 am to 3 pm. The Green Team met and discussed the census. The Borough applied to the County for a grant for census outreach. On April 4th and 5th, invasive weeds will be removed at Great Oak Park. The trees will be planted at a later date. The Green Team is confident we can achieve silver certification. The Green Team needs members and the Environmental Commission needs a secretary to take minutes. Mr. Kunze advised that this position has been advertised in-house. Councilman Pignatelli advised that the Board of Health met on February 18th with a couple of restaurants.

Councilman Biale: Line Dancing will be held March 6 and March 20 at the Senior Center. County Clerk John Hogan will be at the Senior Center march 5th to distribute Senior Discount cards. Movies are held Mondays at 1:30 pm. Trivia will be held March 25th at 1:30 pm. The Wind Creek Casino trip will be held March 31st. The Mens' Club will have a planting and woodcrafting project. The 2020 street cleaning program will begin. The DPW Superintendent is working with Rockland Electric regarding issues with the LED lights. The DPW is asking residents for suggestions on this year's allotment. Councilman Biale had been in touch with the BPU to disucss the LED streetlight conversion and tariffs. He received positive feedback from the BPU. The DPW is continuing the pothole program. Due to the mild winter, the DPW has begun working on items for the Water Accountability Act. There is a meeting with John Yakimik to discuss sidewalks. The electronic bulletin board sign is out to bid.

Councilman Van Eck: The OCC will meet March 2nd. The OCC needs two new members and the TV committee needs members. Recreation baseball and softball signups are taking place until March 15th. After that time, there will be a late fee and no guaranty that there will be a spot open on a team. Summer Sports camp information is on the website. Summer Camp information will be posted in the coming weeks. The Planning Board has moved the April and May meetings to the first Thursday.

Councilman Pignatelli advised that Public Events will be sponsoring Fever Pitch on June 6th. They have agreed to purchase three additional pole ornaments. The Easter Egg Hunt will take place April 4th at 9:30 am.

OPENED FOR PUBLIC DISCUSSION:

On motion of Councilman Biale, seconded by Councilman Levy, this portion of the meeting be opened for public discussion.

ROLL CALL: All yeas, Councilmembers Biale, Knapp, Levy, Pignatelli, Van Eck.

Mike Guadagnino, 34 Hopper Street, advised that this will likely be the final year of the Park Committee. The Park Committee will turn the park over to the Recreation Commission and the Environmental Commission. The Environmental Commission will look over the plans for the dog park. It will be brought back to the Park Committeee and then to the Mayor and Council for final approval. He needs to know what permission is needed to put up a welcome sign thanking sponsors.

Frank Monaco, 60 Thackeray, asked about the Affordable Housing Settlement. Borough Attorney Nylema Nabbie advised that this ordinance is required as part of the settlement agreement with Fanale. Mr. Monaco asked what is the problem with Boswell Engineering. Councilman Levy responded that he objected to some of the billing. It has nothing to do with John Yakimik.

Vic Pedalino, 52 McNomee, asked about the ordinance regarding boarders. He was told it was tabled to the next meeting.
