ROLL CALL: Mayor Schwager called the meeting to order and the Clerk called the roll. Present: Mayor Schwager, Councilmembers Biale, Knapp, Levy, Pignatelli, Van Eck. Absent: Councilman Talamini. Also Present: Lisa M. Duncan, Borough Clerk; Richard Kunze, Borough Administrator; Brian Chewcaskie, Borough Attorney; Kevin Boswell, Borough Engineer.

SALUTE TO THE FLAG:

MOMENT OF SILENCE:

MEETING ANNOUNCEMENT: Mayor Schwager announced this meeting is being held in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Law duly announced and included in the schedule of regular meetings.

EXCUSE ABSENCE:

On motion of Councilman Biale, seconded by Councilman Van Eck, the absence of Councilman Talamini be excused.

ROLL CALL: All yeas, Councilmembers Biale, Knapp, Levy, Pignatelli, Van Eck.

MAYOR'S REPORT:

Mayor Schwager got many emails on Monday from residents complaining about places where there was no social distancing and people not wearing masks over the weekend. She advised that residents must call Police immediately to report a violation so they can enforce it. Mayor Schwager was told there were concerts at the lake. She reiterated that people must call the Police at that time for enforcement purposes. The Borough has been open and transparent about what has been happening in our State and County regarding COVID-19. Mayor Schwager met with Councilman Knapp, the Police Chief, Planning Board Chairman and Borough Planner about long range plans to keep outdoor dining. She advised that restaurants need help but the Borough must maintain public safety for residents. Councilman Knapp will work closely with the Police Chief on this issue. Mayor Schwager advised it is important for residents to do the Census. It helps with getting federal funding. Mayor Schwager asked everyone to be respectful and patient when people are speaking during the meeting.

ROLL CALL: All yeas, Councilmembers Biale, Knapp, Levy, Pignatelli, Van Eck.

WORK SESSION:

REGULATION OF CHICKENS:

Mr. Kunze advised that the issue was discussed by the Board of Health and Animal Control Officer. They have provided recommendations that they would like the Mayor and Council to consider if an ordinance is going to be crafted. Councilman Pignatelli highlighted some of the recommendations which included no males, limiting the number of hens, cleaning of waste, and submittal of plans to the Health Department and Zoning Officer. The Board did not discuss the hen house not being close to the property line.

Mr. Chewcaskie advised he had provided an ordinance from Eatontown which established standards. If the standards are met, a permit is issued. He doesn't know why people would have to go to the Board of Adjustment if they comply with the standards. If people meet the standards, the Zoning Officer should issue a permit.

Mayor Schwager asked how often the hen house should be inspected. Councilman Pignatelli advised it should be inspected yearly. There was discussion on getting rid of the waste and the question was raised if it could be composted. Councilman Pignatelli responded it must be put out with the trash. The composting process creates heat and the animal waste would smell.

Mr. Chewcaskie asked if we are requiring an appearance before the Board of Adjustment of requiring notice to adjacent property owners. Mayor Schwager responded that notice should be provided to property owners. Mr. Chewcaskie believes people should get a zoning permit issued by the Zoning Officer. Councilman Biale asked what would happen if someone doesn't comply with the standards once a permit is issued. Mr. Chewcaskie responded they would receive a summons. Mr. Kunze asked if the Board of Health would enforce.

AMENDMENTS TO BERGEN COUNTY JIF BYLAWS:

Mr. Kunze explained that the Executive Committee of the Bergen County JIF approved amendments to the Bylaws. This now must go to member municipalities for approval. The changes deal with conflict of interest for the Risk Managers. A resolution will be listed on the next agenda.

Mr. Kunze advised that the Borough is currently under contract with the Bergen County Health Department through a shared service. They provide a variety of services to the Borough. The contract expires at the end of the year. The County wants to extend the contract for a year under the same terms. A resolution will be listed on the next agenda.

OLD BUSINESS:

Councilman Van Eck has heard that residents complained about music being played after certain hours. He encouraged residents to call the Police immediately to complain. Mayor Schwager reiterated that the Police Chief advised residents have to call the Police at that time so enforcement can take place.

COUNCIL REPORTS:

Councilman Van Eck: There is no report from Planning Board and they will not be meeting in August. The OCC is looking for volunteers for the newsletter committee and the television committee. The next meeting will be held September 14th at 7:30 pm. He advised residents to subscribe to the Borough's YouTube page. Recreation completed a successful summer camp program. Kudos to the staff and the Recreation Commission. There was only one COVID incident because of all the safety measures in place. Recreation is wrapping up the baseball and softball seasons next week. Football, cheerleading and soccer will begin next week. Winter sports sign ups will begin in September. The basketball and wrestling programs are in limbo.

Councilman Levy: The Shade Tree Commission is looking for members. The Borough Attorney is reviewing the Shade Tree ordinance. The Flood Commission has not met.

Councilman Pignatelli: The Environmental Commission could not meet because of the power outage. The Board of Health will meet in September and review actions to be taken. He reiterated the importance of responding to the Census. It is incredibly important for Oakland residents to complete the census because tens of billions of dollars are at stake.

Councilman Biale: The Senior Center has a mix of hybrid programs. Seniors must register in advance for in-person classes. Seniors can make an appointment to borrow games and puzzles. There is a new program, by appointment only, for anyone who needs assistance navigating Medicare. The Senior Center Director is in the office Monday to Friday to provide assistance.

The bus service will resume Tuesday with shopping at 9 am. Seniors should call to sign up for the bus. The Senior Center Director took a poll of Seniors regarding garbage collection. They would rather keep the twice per week pick up. The Seniors also felt the large cans for the one-arm bandit would be too difficult to move and there would be issues with storage. The DPW has submitted a work order to Rockland Electric for this year's allotment of LED lights. The request is focusing on school routes and intersections and work will begin in October. The garbage hauler is having difficulty with equipment breaking down and employees calling out sick. They promise the yard waste will be picked up Thursday and Friday. Councilman Biale advised that Borough officials were on the calls daily with Rockland Electric during the storm. He thanked OEM coordinator Roy Bauberger for countless of hours of work. Mr. Bauberger was the main point of contact to locate Rockland Electric crews. This was a major storm and the distribution centers were without power.

Councilman Knapp: The Police has a new community outreach program called Project Spotlight. It provides resdients with an opportunity to identify a problem in the neighborhood like speeding issues or disregard for traffic control devices. The Oakland Police Department thanks residents for the patience and perserverence during the power outage. The Police Department had 100 storm related calls in addition to the normal calls. There were temporary traffic control measures in place. Councilman Knapp stated that Orange and Rockland did not hold up to the agreement put in place a couple of years ago and their response to this storm was a complete failure. Councilman Knapp assured residents that Oakland's emergency services were well prepared days before the storm. Councilman Knapp advised that Borough Engineer Kevin Boswell was in touch with the Governor's office and the DOT will meet with us regarding the issues on 287.

Mayor Schwager advised residents that they can file a claim with Orange and Rockland if they were out of power over 48 continous hours.

OPENED FOR PUBLIC COMMENT:

On motion of Councilman Pignatelli, seconded by Councilman Levy, this portion of the meeting be opened for public comment.

ROLL CALL: All yeas, Councilmembers Biale, Knapp, Levy, Pignatelli, Van Eck.

Mike Rose, 665 Ramapo Valley Road, commented that chicken waste must be picked up every day but the garbage is only going to be collected once per week. He asked for a survey from Boswell for Station Park. He asked if the town gets reports from the State regarding the census and asked if the town could promote committees who are looking for volunteers. He advised there are a lot of people in town who want to volunteer. He commented on complaints about noise from generators and asked if the town can do an ordinance to provide direction to residents on generator use. Mr. Rose advised that the Council should have respect for one another and get along.

CLOSED FOR PUBLIC COMMENT:

On motion of Councilman Levy, seconded by Councilman Pignatelli, this portion of the meeting be closed to public comment.
