WORK SESSION:

ORDINANCE AMENDING CODE-HUNTING AND DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS:

Mr. Chewcaskie advised that the State circulated a memo that various municipal ordinances were not in conformance with State law regarding the discharge of firearms. He worked with the Police Department to draft an ordinance that is in conformance. The language in the first two parts is the exact language that the State has provided. Councilman Kulmala questioned 3-9.1(a). Mr. Chewcaskie responded that it is the exact language the State required. Councilman Kulmala asked how this will affect retired Police officers. Mr. Chewcaskie responded that if they have a firearms ID, they are permitted to transport a weapon. If they have a right-to-carry, the weapon can be loaded. Mr. Chewcaskie advised this will be listed for introduction at the next meeting.

HOLIDAY BOWL RIGHT-OF-WAY ENCROACHMENT:

Mr. Chewcaskie advised that Holiday Bowl has exisiting parking along Spruce Street that is located in the municipal right-of-way. Holiday Bowl went before the Board of Adjustment for approval for improvements to their property. Approval was granted subject to Holiday Bowl receiving approval from the Borough. Mr. Chewcaskie suggested a license be issued and advised that he will prepare a license agreement.

COUNCIL REPORTS:

Councilman Talamini: No report.

Councilman Kulmala: The Library furniture is being installed and they are working through the punch list items. The OCC issued the first newsletter. They are looking for volunteers. The DPW did a good job installing desks and updating the tv control room.

Councilman Biale: He spoke about Senior events such as movies and bingo. On September 6th, there will be a presentation by Valley Hospital on functional foods. The DPW is flushing valves and hydrants for compliance with the Water Accountability Act. It takes two men 18 minutes to open and exercise each valve. Rockland Electric has updated specific fixtures at residents' requeests and Borough requests. The DPW received notification about poison ivy by the wooded area around the walking path. A contractor came in to remove the poison ivy. Boswell will be working on water system mapping. Councilman Biale advised that he received a call from a resident about tree limbs that came down during the storm. He sent an email to DPW Superintendent Marcucilli on Saturday and the DPW was at there on Monday removing the tree limbs. He gave the DPW a shout out for their quick response.

Councilman Levy: There is no Flood Commission meeting in July and August. The next Flood Commission meeting will be the second Monday in September at 7:30 pm. The Flood Commission is looking for two new members. There was a meeting with the Army Corps of Engineers and the NJDEP regarding the Army Corps project. A report will be submitted on maintenance items. The Station Park grant application is being submitted. We are working on the second Patriots' Way Bridge grant. Tonight a resolution was passed to authorize the grant

company to file a grant application for the roller hockey rink. Councilman Kulmala explained that we are applying for two grants for the roller hockey rink. Councilman Levy advised that we are working with the Fire Department to see if we can get a grant for the fire truck.

Councilman Knapp: No report.

Mayor Schwager thanked Borough Engineer Kevin Boswell for all his work and help with the Northwest Bergen County Utilities Authority. She feels strongly that sewers are coming which will help the downtown. Mayor Schwager commented that Borough Engineer John Yakimik is working hard with our residents on various issues. Mayor Schwager advised that she attended a meeting with Councilman Biale and Councilman Talamini and the School Board members and Superintendent. It was a very productive meeting. There will be more meetings in the future regarding school safety.
