Also Present: Lisa M. Duncan, Borough Clerk; Richard Kunze, Borough Administrator; Brian Chewcaskie, Borough Attorney.

SALUTE TO THE FLAG:

MOMENT OF SILENCE:

MEETING ANNOUNCEMENT: Mayor Schwager announced this meeting is being held in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Law duly announced and included in the schedule of regular meetings.

OATH OF OFFICE

Mayor Schwager administered the Oath of Office to new Police Officer Charles Kelly.

AWARD PRESENTATION BY NJ NARCOTICS ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS ASSOCIATION:

Felix Pacheco, President of the NJ Narcotics Enforcement Officers Association, congratulated the Oakland Police Department on their work that led to seizure of 5 lbs of marijuana and money, charges of distribution of narcotics and money laundering. The investigation took a lot of effort. He presented awards to Lt. Chris Eldridge, Detective Mark Piercy, Detective Ed McDermott, Sgt. Keith Sanzari, Sgt. Tim Keenan, Ptl. Keith Docwra, Ptl. Ryan O'Keefe, Ptl. Don Harvey, Ptl. Joseph Noury, and Ptl. Luis Gaviria.

Chief Kasper thanked the Mayor and Council for their support.

MAYOR'S REPORT:

Mayor Schwager advised that on July 1st, she met with a new committee. There were representatives from the schools, the community and the government. This committee will deal with how to help the community deal with mental health issues. It is part of the Stigma free initiative. The committee is called "Lets Talk Oakland". Mayor Schwager will be appointing members to the Access For All Committee tonight. Mayor Schwager announced she also has a volunteer to run the Green Team which means the Borough can get recertified by Sustainable Jersey. The Library is sponsoring a concert with a band called Kootz at Vets Park on Thursday July 14th at 6:30 pm. The raindate for the concert is July 19th at 6:30 pm.

OPENED FOR PUBLIC DISCUSSION:

On motion of Councilman Biale, seconded by Councilman Kulmala, this portion of the meeting be opened for public discussion.

ROLL CALL: All yeas, Councilmembers Biale, Coira, Jensen, Kulmala, Talamini, Visconti.

Nancy Teichman, 70 Spear Street, commented that the new parking ordinance for the high school students is punishing residents especially the ones on the other end of Spear Street from where the students park. She explained that her house has multiple cars and they usually need to park on

the street in the morning. Chief Kasper explained that if students are no longer allowed to park on Sheffield like they do now, they will park further away and walk. The problem would just move to the streets further away.

Bob Hoffman, President of the NJ Municipal Managers Association and Borough Administrator of Emerson, congratulated the Borough on attaining the AAA Bond rating. This is very rare in NJ as there are only six municipalities that have this rating. He read a letter of commendation from the NJMMA. Mr. Kunze advised that this effort began ten years ago and has been a group effort.

Deanna Macek, 115 Truman Blvd, advised she is involved with the bear education research program. She spoke about the increase of the trophy bear hunt by the Division of Fish and Wildlife without public opinion. The public is against bear hunting. She asked the Mayor and Council to make Oakland off-limits to bear hunting.

Doreen Frega, League of Humane Voters Animal League, distributed resolutions adopted by other municipalities to not allow bear hunting. She would like this issue on the next agenda. Mr. Chewcaskie explained that the discharge of firearms is already prohibited in Oakland and hunting is already prohibited in Oakland. However, that does not include land that is under the jurisdiction of the State or the County.

RESOLUTION 16-142 AUTHORIZE POLICY-EMERGENCY PURCHASES

On motion of Councilman Biale, seconded by Councilman Kulmala, the following resolution be introduced, adopted and duly passed by roll call vote:

WHEREAS, section N.J.S.A. 40A:11-6 of the Local Public Contracts Law permits local contracting units to use emergency purchasing procedures, and pursuant to corresponding Local Public Contracts Law rules adopted by the State's Division of Local Government Services on December 4, 2000, the governing body of each contracting unit shall adopt rules to ensure that there are written procedures for determining and confirming the existence of an emergency; and

WHEREAS, according to N.J.A.C. 5:34-6.1(b) such rules or regulations shall include such provisions that ensure that if initially designated individuals are not available, there is a clear chain of command to ensure that there are always appropriate individuals to make such decisions; and

WHEREAS, when an emergency arises requiring certain purchases to be made pursuant to emergency purchasing procedures, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Oakland has determined that the following procedures shall apply.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Oakland, Bergen County, State of New Jersey that the following is adopted as the emergency purchasing policy for the Borough of Oakland.

A. POLICY GOVERNING EMERGENCY PURCHASING PROCEDURES

- 1. Contracts, including purchase orders, shall be entered into, and funds committed or expended for an emergency pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-6 and corresponding rules, N.J.A.C. 5:34-6.1, subject to the following requirements:
 - a. An actual or imminent emergency must exist requiring the immediate delivery of the goods or the performance of the service(s);
 - b. The emergency must directly affect the public health, safety or welfare, and requires the immediate delivery of goods or the performance of service(s);
 - c. Emergency purchasing shall not be used for administrative convenience or for failure to plan. Sound business practices shall be used when an emergency purchase must be made;
 - d. The emergency purchasing procedure may not be used unless the need for the goods or performance of the service(s) could not have been reasonably foreseen or the needs for such goods or service(s) has arisen notwithstanding a good faith effort on the part of the Borough of Oakland to plan for the purchase of any required goods or service(s);
 - e. The contract shall be of such limited duration as to meet only the immediate needs of the emergency declared;
 - f. Under no circumstances shall the emergency purchasing procedures be used to enter into a multi-year contract;
 - g. Any emergency condition(s) in which the estimated cost is in excess of the bid threshold shall be approved by the Mayor and Council.

B. PROCEDURE FOR THE DECLARATION OF AN EMERGENCY

- a. A department head, or in their absence his/her designee, as soon as reasonably possible, shall notify the Borough Administrator of the need for awarding of a contract or purchase order, the nature of the emergency, the time of its occurrence and the need for invoking the emergency provision of the law;
- b. If the Borough Administrator is satisfied that an emergency exists, he/she shall be authorized to award a contract or contracts for such purposes as may be necessary to respond to the emergent needs;
- c. Within 48 hours of an emergency occurrence, the department head, or in their absence his/her designee, shall submit to the Borough Administrator a written report

(Certification of Request for Emergency Purchases) providing the information referenced above;

- d. In the Borough Administrator's absence, the chain of command for adherence to the requirements if 1,2 and 3 shall be:
 - 1. Chief Financial Officer
 - 2. Borough Clerk
 - 3. Chief of Police
 - 4. Superintendent of Public Works
 - 5. Borough Attorney

ROLL CALL: All yeas, Councilmembers Biale, Coira, Jensen, Kulmala, Talamini, Visconti.

RESOLUTION 16-143 SUPPORT SCHOOL FUNDING REFORM

Councilman Biale advised that he heard from various legislators that this funding reform would be thrown out if taken to court. Mr. Chewcaskie responded that there is the question whether the funding would withstand the thorough education requirement. Councilman Visconti advised that there have been several articles on why the reform would stand up in the Supreme Court. He thinks this would help the community immensely if passed and the Council should endorse the concept.

On motion of Councilman Biale, seconded by Councilman Visconti, the following resolution be introduced, adopted and duly passed by roll call vote:

WHEREAS, Governor Chris Christie has outlined a plan to overhaul the school funding system which would give every school district in the State of New Jersey the exact same amount of State aid per student; and

WHEREAS, the plan, referred to as the "Fairness Formula", would provide 75 percent of school districts an increase in state aid thereby easing the property tax burden on local residents; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's Office has provided an estimate that the "Fairness Formula" would result in an additional \$12,000,000 in State aid, which would equate to a property tax reduction of approximately \$2,250 for the average home; and

WHEREAS, Governor Christie is requesting state lawmakers to put this plan before the voters on the fall of 2017 ballot; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Oakland believes that the "Fairness Formula" would be of great benefit to both its schools and residents alike and supports the Governor's request to have this plan placed on the 2017 ballot.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Oakland hereby support Governor Christie's "Fairness Formula" with respect to the overhauling of the school funding system.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Oakland that a true copy of this Resolution in support of the "Fairness Formula" shall be sent to Governor Christie; Senator Gerald Cardinale; Assemblyman Robert Auth; and Assemblywoman Holly T. Schepisi.

That said Ordinance be published in full in The Record on or before July 16, 2016 together with notice of this introduction and of the time and place for further consideration for final passage, and that the Clerk post a copy of said Ordinance in the Municipal Building and make copies available to the public.

Mr. Chewcaskie wanted to make sure the radio tower and compost facility site were excluded. Councilman Visconti questioned the status of the LSRP for Great Oak Park. Mr.Kunze explained that he wants to get an update from Boswell. There will be a resolution on the next agenda to approve the ROSI.

AMEND SIGN ORDINANCE:

Mr. Kunze advised that the Planning Board Attorney sent a request to amend the sign ordinance for requirements for LED signs. Mr. Kunze advised that there is also a Supreme Court decision that may affect another provision of our sign ordinance. Mr. Chewcaskie advised that there was an amendment to the sign ordinance enacted within the past 5 years in regards to LED signage. The Planning Board found that portions of the ordinance are not necessary or are too harsh on applicants. He also explained that the regulations on temporary signage has to be looked at in regard to the Supreme Court decision. He will advised when this amended ordinance should be listed on the agenda.

NEW BUSINESS:

Councilman Visconti showed renderings from the architect for the old section of the Library. He explained that once the construction drawings have been done, the project can go out to bid and we will have an idea of how much the project will cost.

COUNCIL REPORTS:

Councilwoman Coira: The volleyball and football camp signups are still being accepted. The camps will take place the week of July 25th. The winter sports sign ups will take place in September after school starts.

Councilman Jensen: The Planning Board will meet tomorrow at 7 pm at the Senior Center.

Councilman Visconti: He commented that the AAA bond rating is an outstanding achievement for the Borough. He thanked Richard Kunze and Donna Mollineaux as well as former CFO Jim Mangin, Auditor Frank DiMaria and the Mayor and Council members for the support over the years. The Park Committee will meet Monday at 8 pm at the Danny D'Elia building. There will be no Flood Committee meetings until September. The Library will hold a concert tomorrow at Veteran's Park.

Councilman Biale: The Senior Center will hold an ice cream social on July 21st.

Councilman Kulmala: He advised that the First Aid Squad has taken 504 calls this year so far as compared to 336 at this time last year. The First Aid Squad has welcomed three new EMT's in the Spring and there are two in the Summer class. They also have new prospects. The new ambulance has a completion date at the end of August. The First Aid squad is having their Fund drive. Councilman Kulmala advised that the Public Safety Committee will be scheduling another meeting.

Councilman Talamini: No report.
