MEETING CALLED TO ORDER: By Mayor Schwager at 7:30 pm.

ROLL CALL: Mayor Schwager called the meeting to order and the Clerk called the roll. Present: Mayor Schwager, Councilmembers Biale, Kulmala, Pignatelli, Slasinski, Talamini.

Absent: Councilman Van Eck. Also Present: Lisa M. Duncan, Borough Clerk; Richard Kunze, Borough Administrator; Brian Chewcaskie, Borough Attorney; John Yakimik, Borough Engineer.

SALUTE TO THE FLAG:

MOMENT OF SILENCE:

MEETING ANNOUNCEMENT: Mayor Schwager announced that this meeting is being held in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Law, duly announced, submitted to the newspaper and advertised more than 48 hours in advance of the meeting and notice posted in the Municipal Building and on the Borough website.

EXCUSE ABSENCE:

On motion of Councilman Biale, seconded by Councilman Kulmala, the absence of Councilman Van Eck be excused.

ROLL CALL: All yeas, Councilmembers Biale, Kulmala, Pignatelli, Slasinski, Talamini

MAYOR'S REPORT:

The Northwest Bergen Lifestyle Magazine highlighted the Oakland Green Team's reforestation project. Mayor Schwager thanked the Green Team for all they do. Mayor Schwager announced the Borough Engineer will give an update on Patriots Way Bridge later in the meeting but the bridge is safe to use. Mayor Schwager advised the residents of Glen Gray Road that a meeting will be scheduled with Mahwah to discuss paving. Mayor Schwager advised that a full explanation of the third quarter estimated tax bills will be given by the CFO. Mayor Schwager advised that she vetoed the final adoption of Ordinance 21-Code-828 and she read her veto statement:

At the June 9, 2021 Oakland Borough Council Meeting, the Borough Council members (hereinafter "Council") voted to pass the above referenced Ordinance by a vote of 4 to approve and 2 to oppose. Said Ordinance amends and supplements the Code of the Borough of Oakland with a new chapter entitled,

"CHAPTER 8, CANNABIS, PROHIBITION OF ALL CLASSES OF BUSINESS SO AS TO PROHIBIT THE OPERATION OF ANY CLASS OF CANNABIS BUSINESS WITHIN THE GEOGRAPHICAL BOUNDARIES OF THE BOROUGH OF OAKLAND... (hereinafter "Ordinance").

The Borough of Oakland operates as a Borough form of government (hereinafter "Borough"). The powers of the Mayor under this form of Government in the State of New Jersey are set forth in N.J.S.A. 40A:60-5. The Mayor's powers relating to ordinances are specific. "The Mayor shall, within ten days after receiving [an] ordinance, Sundays excepted, either approve the ordinance by affixing his signature thereto or return it to the Council by delivering it to the Clerk together with a statement setting forth his objections thereto or any item or part thereof."

<u>I hereby object to Oakland Ordinance 21-CODE_828, within the time prescribed by the Statute and provide this notice as my VETO.</u>

As prescribed by the Statute, I set forth my objections as follows: Sixty-seven percent (67%) of Oakland voters voted for the legalization of marijuana in the State of New Jersey. Legalization of marijuana permits the use of cannabis products. Individuals can legally purchase the products, and businesses can legally manufacture, cultivate, distribute, dispense, deliver and sell the products.

As Mayor, I established an Ad Hoc Committee (hereinafter "Committee") made up of residents who are on both sides of the issue, together with our Borough Planner, Borough Administrator, two Councilmen and me, to research, discuss and forward their findings to the Council. The Committee met June 9, 2021 and June 16, 2021. I had requested the Council to refrain from passing the ordinance on June 9, 2021 until the Committee forwarded their findings. Said request was ignored. At the June 9, 2021 Committee meeting, both Councilmen who sit on the Committee agreed to keep the Ordinance on the table. Then two (2) hours later, on same day, during the Council meeting, one of the Councilmen who previously agreed (at the Committee meeting) that the Ordinance should remain on the table, made the motion to pass the Ordinance, denying what happened at the Committee meeting. The next meeting of the Committee is scheduled for July 7, 2021. The Committee has received copies of sample Ordinances. The Committee has received financial information. The Committee has received our town's zoning maps. The Committee has received lists of vacancies in our commercial zones. There is still time to present the Committee's findings to the Council.

With unanimous approval, the Oakland Planning Board sent two letters to the Council opposing the Ordinance. The latest vote included a Councilman who abstained at the Planning Board meeting, then seconded the motion to approve the Ordinance at the Council meeting. The appointed Oakland Planning Board members are educated, professional business people with financial experience and long time residents of our Borough of Oakland. Both recommendations from the Planning Board were ignored.

The Borough of Oakland has geographical zoning areas of our town that are not within residential areas. There are vacancies in the industrial and commercial areas of our town.

State law permits delivery of cannabis throughout Oakland. The Borough cannot prohibit same. The Borough cannot stop people buying cannabis. The Borough cannot stop people using cannabis. The Ordinance only precludes receiving economic benefit. If we do not move forward and move to the forefront, businesses will go elsewhere. This is simply Marketing 101.

The Borough needs financial assistance to help stabilize taxes in Oakland.

Important financial considerations for the residents of Oakland ignored by the Oakland Borough Council-In addition to collecting taxes from occupied buildings, (1) The Borough may assess a 2% transfer tax of gross receipts from each sale by a cannabis cultivator and a cannabis manufacturer; and (2) the Borough may assess a 1% tax of gross receipts for each sale by a cannabis wholesaler.

The Borough shall be able to designate how the money received will be used. For example, the Committee member suggested possible designated accounts for receivables to be used to pay down our debt service or to be used for the many infrastructure projects the Borough needs.

For the foregoing reasons, I ask the members of the Oakland Borough Council not to override my veto, but to work with the Ad Hoc Committee to create a viable Ordinance which will financially benefit the residents of Oakland.

OPENED FOR PUBLIC COMMENT:

On motion of Councilman Slasinski, seconded by Councilman Kulmala, this portion of the meeting be opened for public comment.

ROLL CALL: All yeas, Councilmembers Biale, Kulmala, Pignatelli, Slasinski, Talamini.

David Sandler, 24 Academy Circle, requested the Council to take the Mayor's veto seriously and reconsider prohibiting marijuana. He hopes to hear an update on the sewers.

Steve Panosian, 69 Glen Gray Road, advised that the Mayor has received plenty of emails from Glen Gray residents about the repaving of Glen Gray Road. The anxiety and frustration is growing. It is not safe to walk the street. He is not happy with the tax increase and his street still needs to be paved.

Michael Pritchard, 23 Calumet Ave, is concerned about the river and the Clean Water Act. He stated the Borough is going to need a permit from the EPA for property below ShopRite. He will be giving the Mayor some information he researched.

Maria Glasson, 51 Princeton Terrace, is in favor of marijuana and stated the Council is giving away free money.

Barbra Stansfield, 19 Wilson Street, stated the Council should move forward to allow marijuana. It is important to get that money.

Rachel Gregory, 2 Kiowa Terrace, wants to know the Council members' views on cannabis. She asked why the Skyview relining project will begin at the start of summer when they are going to want to spend time in their yards. The residents need more information about this project.

Michael Kozak, 24 Cayuga Ave., advised that they sold 950 wristbands in 61 minutes at the carnival tonight. He hopes everyone comes to the carnival.

CLOSED FOR PUBLIC COMMENT:

On motion of Councilman Talamini, seconded by Councilman Kulmala, this portion of the meeting be closed to public comment.

Mayor Schwager announced that she, the Borough Engineer and the Borough Administrator are scheduling a meeting with the Mahwah Engineer and Administrator to discuss paving Glen Gray Road.

Councilman Talamini advised there was a problem with the 3rd quarter tax bills. CFO David Young explained that the tax rate for the full year is 2.4%. An average assessed home of \$ 435,000 paid \$ 13,045 in taxes last year. This year the average assessed home will pay \$ 13,363 which is an increase of \$ 317. He explained that when the 3rd quarter tax bills were generated, the entire increase was put in the third quarter. He explained that when the County give us the final tax rate, the 4th quarter bills will be calculated. The 4th quarter bills should be around what the 1st and 2nd quarter bills were. He explained that estimated bills were done because the County does not strike a rate until the end of August and the bills wouldn't go out until the end of September. This poses a cash flow problem because the Borough still has to pay the school and County taxes. Mr. Young explained that the company was sent the 3rd quarter and the full year rate and they loaded the wrong rate. He explained that the process has been changed moving forward so this will not happen again.

WORK SESSION:

The discussion on breweries, brew pubs, distilleries and wineries will be carried.

VETO OF ORDINANCE 21-CODE-828:

Councilman Pignatelli advised that from the beginning of discussions on cannabis, he was in favor of banning it. He stated the Cannabis Commission has bot adopted any rules or regulations yet. The Council should wait for those rules and regulations before we adopt any of our own. He stated that when the planner discussed this, Councilman Pignatelli asked if the Council banned cannabis now would they be able to revisit this in six months. The response was the Council could revisit the ordinance. When Councilman Van Eck asked which license Councilman Pignatelli would be in favor of, Councilman Pignatelli responded that with 30 years experience in public health, he has seen how marijuana affects the cognitive ability of young people and destroys the cilia in the lungs. Councilman Pignatelli stated that at the last ad-hoc committee meeting there was another member who wanted to hear from the legislators. Councilman Pignatelli read a letter from a legislator of the Colorado bill who spoke of carcinoges and chemicals and how indoor marijuana is the worst pollution. Councilman Pignatelli stated that the League of Municipalities is recommending banning marijuana until the rules and regulations are adopted. He stated that in the June 14th issue of The Record, there were 3 dozen municipalities that have adopted ordinances restricting all licenses. Councilman Pignatelli stated he takes this issue very seriously and that all the pros and cons must be looked at.

Councilman Biale stated that every opportunity should be provided to come up with a new revenue opportunity. The Planning Board members have recommended that licenses be allowed to offset taxes. Councilman Kulmala stated that this ban will give the ad-hoc committee more time to do their work and analyze this.

MOTION TO OVERRIDE VETO:

On motion of Councilman Kulmala, seconded by Councilman Pignatelli, the Council consents to override the Mayor's veto of Ordinance 21-Code-828.

ROLL CALL: Yeas, Councilmembers Kulmala, Pignatelli, Slasinski, Talamini. Nay, Councilman Biale.

Mayor Schwager stated that the Council needed four votes to override the veto so there is still a ban on marijuana licenses to help offset taxes. Mayor Schwager stated she has no financial interest in any marijuana company. She is thinking how to stabilize taxes.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mayor Schwager spoke about a vehicle on the front lawn of a residence on the corner of Route 202 and Brandywine. She stated it looks like a junkyard. She is asking property maintenance to do something. Mayor Schwager spoke about the plan of the Chamber of Commerce to start beautifying the town. Councilman Biale commented that it was discovered during the walk through the downtown last year, that a pizza place in the downtown had 12 flags and signs in front of the business with no permits. He stated that it has been nine months since he has brought this issue up and it has not been taken care of. Councilman Talamini asked what ordinance they are violating. Councilman Biale spoke of the garbage in front of the Dunkin Donuts. He stated that business should be issued notice of violations. Councilman Talamini questioned what is happening with the car on the front lawn. Mr. Kunze responded that the homeowner was issued a Notice of Violation and they have ten days to comply according to the code. Mayor Schwager stated that the Administration Committee needs to go through the ordinances. Mr. Kunze stated that changes need to be made to the code. Mr. Chewcaskie advised he is working revisions to the property maintenance code for the next meeting. There are also other changes required. Mr. Kunze will provide a report to the Mayor and Council of the Notices of Violations that have been issued by Code Enforcement.

COUNCIL REPORTS:

Councilman Biale: The Borough received a letter stating the Patriots Way Bridge project will be eligible for funding. The Borough may be able to get the entire project funded by the Federal Government. Mr. Kunze stated this would require an act of Congress so there is no timetable. He will advise the Governing Body when he hears further information. Borough Engineer John Yakimik advised that Boswell is moving towards a September date to advertise for bid for the bridge project. He advised that the Bergen County Soil Conservation District had comments that are being addressed but he does not anticipate it will affect the timetable. He expects the plans to be sent July 2nd to the State and Bergen County for review and comment. Councilman Pignatelli asked if the start date will be delayed if the Borough receives the grant funding. Councilman Biale stated it might. Mayor Schwager stated that they have been assured by the Borough Engineer that the bridge is safe for vehicular and pedestrian traffic. Councilman Kulmala asked what strings will be attached if the Federal Government awards the funding. Mr. Kunze responded we not know what program this funding would go through so we do not know the federal requirements that would be attached. Councilman Talamini asked if it affects the Borough adversely if the project is started before we accept grant funding from the federal goverment. Mr. Kunze responded that generally you cannot start a grant project ahead of time

and use grant money awarded later. He would not recommend starting the project until the Borough hears about the funding. Councilman Talamini asked if the cost to the project could increase while the Borough is waiting to hear about funding. Mr. Yakimik responded that Boswell is doing estimates monthly. He stated that within the next two months, the Council will have to make a critical decision. Councilman Biale stated that hopefully pandemic prices will start dropping. Mayor Schwager stated that the project estimate is approximately \$ 5 million, the funding request for the Federal Government is approximately \$ 4 million and the Borough has approximately \$ 1 million in funding already. She stated at some point, the Council will have to make financial decision.

Councilman Biale advised that the Water and Sewer Committee had an extensive meeting and Councilman Slasinski is now on the committee. The Borough is still wating for IBank's approval for the sewer decommissioning project. Borough officials are in touch with IBank. The DEP is still reviewing the Wastewater Management Plan. The Borough is waiting for the easements for the Ramapo Valley Road sidewalk project to be returned. The excavation of the footing for the digital sign will take place tomorrow. The schematic for the Stream House will be ready in July. Councilman Biale thanked Ronnie and Larry Levine for the yearly donation of plants for the Borough.

Councilman Talamini asked if someone could look at the bridge on the Van Allen House property.

Councilman Kulmala: As of June 15th, the Oakland tv channel will be shown in HD on Verizon channel 2145. The tv committee is showing a monthly matinee movie at 4:30 pm. The newsletter and tv committee need members. The newsletter will be sent July 1st. The next OCC meeting will be held July 12th. The Green Team's community garden is flourishing. The Arts Amble was a major success with 30 artists performing in Oakland. The Green Team is submitting for 565 points to Sustainable Jersey. They are doing a great job. The Great Oak Park committee will meet next week to discuss the bandshell.

Councilman Pignatelli: The Police Department advised there are individuals trying to scam residents on new roofs and driveways. The Senior Center barbeque is postponed to Friday. The Bergen County health checks will resume in July at the Senior Center. Councilman Pignatelli commended the Police Department where officers took 13 certification courses.

Councilman Talamini: He attended the Valley Middle School graduation and the singer did a great job. The Finance Department has assured the problem with the tax bills will not happen again. The Public Events carnival will run today through Saturday. Councilman Talamini thanked Public Events Chairman Chopper Russo for all he does for the Borough. The Public Events Committee is always looking for help. Councilman Talamini thanked the DPW for the held with the 11u gold team tournament last weekend. He stated that other towns compliment our recreation fields.

Councilman Slasinski: Registration for the Library summer reading program continues. The childrens' summer reading program kicks off Tuesday June 29th with free ice cream. The Library has books for the Indian Hills summer reading list. The air conditioning is still be worked on at the Library.

Mayor Schwager advised that the next meeting of the marijuana ad-hoc committee will take place on July 7th.

On motion of Councilman Biale, seconded by Councilman Talamini, this portion of the meeting be opened for public comment.
