REGULAR MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL HELD AT THE MUNICIPAL COURT /COUNCIL CHAMBERS 10 LAWLOR DRIVE, OAKLAND, NEW JERSEY WEDNESDAY SEPTEMBER 26, 2018

MOVE TO EXECUTIVE SESSION:

On motion of Councilman Pignatelli, seconded by Councilman Kulmala, the following resolution be introduced, adopted and duly passed on roll call vote:

ROLL CALL: Mayor Schwager called the meeting to order and the Clerk called the roll. Present: Mayor Schwager, Councilmembers Biale, Kulmala, Levy, Pignatelli, Talamini. Absent: Councilman Knapp. Also Present: Lisa M. Duncan, Borough Clerk; Richard Kunze, Borough Administrator; Brian Chewcaskie, Borough Attorney.

MOMENT OF SILENCE:

MEETING ANNOUNCEMENT: Mayor Schwager announced this meeting is being held in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Law duly announced and included in the schedule of regular meetings.

MOTION TO EXCUSE ABSENCE:

On motion of Councilman Biale, seconded by Councilman Pignatelli, the absence of Councilman Knapp be excused.

ROLL CALL: All yeas, Councilmembers Biale, Kulmala, Levy, Pignatelli, Talamini.

MAYOR'S REPORT:

The Library Grand Opening will be held October 13th at 11 am. She thanked everyone who has helped on the project. Mayor Schwager congratulated the Gerard Berman School for receiving the 2018 BCUA Environmental Awareness Challenge Grant. The Oakland Custom Car show will be held on September 30th. It is being run by Oakland-Franklin Lakes Rotary. All proceeds will go to a charitable military veterans group. Mayor Schwager advised that the marijuana ordinance must be tabled. She explained that we are working on fine-tuning the final ordinance to protect us from litigation. The ordinance was sent to the Planning Board for comment since it involves zoning. The Borough Attorney is working with the Planning Board Attorney because we want to do the ordinance correctly. Mayor Schwager advised that she and the Borough Engineer met with P.S.E. & G. and the County regarding the condition of Ramapo Valley Road where the gas main was replaced. The road will not be repaved until November because it has to settle. She asked people to be patient and not to speed due to the condition of the road. She advised that the job needed to be done because the gas pipes were old and needed to be replaced.

Beatrice Mandice, 2119 Warren Way, Wanaque, thanked the Mayor and Council for their support for the Walk for Peace held last weekend. She thanked the Police Department for protecting everyone.

Corky Swiers, 22 Ramapo Terrace, has a problem with a dead tree across the street from her house that is dangerous because it will fall on her house. Borough Engineer John Yakimik

advised that he brought up the situation at a meeting with the DOT yesterday. He forwarded the info and the DOT has assured they will take care of the tree. They are treating this as an emergency.

Robin Gonzalez, 7 Rock Ledge, is curious as to the scope of the marijuana ordinance. There is a difference between medical marijuana and recreation marijuana. Mr. Chewcaskie advised that the present draft only prohibits retail establishments not medical dispensaries. He is waiting for the recommendations from the Planning Board. Mr. Chewcaskie has been informed that we may have legislation in effect at the State level by the beginning of the year. Mayor Schwager explained that the Council is being diligent trying to separate medical marijuana from retail.

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Borough of Oakland to treat employees and prospective employees in a manner consistent with all applicable employment laws and regulations including, but not limited to Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended by the Equal Opportunity Act of 1972, the Age Discrimination in Employment Act, the Equal Pay for Equal Work Act, the Fair Labor Standards Act, the New Jersey Law Against Discrimination,

the Americans with Disabilities Act, the Family and Medical Leave Act, the Conscientious Employee Protection Act, the Public Employee Occupational Safety and Health Act, (the New Jersey Civil Service Act,) (the New Jersey Attorney General's guidelines with respect to Police Department personnel matters,) the New Jersey Workers Compensation Act, the Federal Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act (COBRA) and the Open Public Meeting Act; and

- WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council has determined that there is a need for personnel policies and procedures to ensure that employees and prospective employees are treated in a manner consistent with these laws and regulations.
- NOW, THEREBY, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Oakland that the Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual attached hereto is hereby adopted.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that these personnel policies and procedures shall apply to all municipal officials, appointees, employees, volunteers and independent contractors. In the event there is a conflict between these rules and any collective bargaining agreement, personnel services contract or Federal or State law, the terms and conditions of that contract or law shall prevail. In all other cases, these policies and procedures shall prevail.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this manual is intended to provide guidelines covering public service by municipal employees and is not a contract. The provisions of this manual may be amended and supplemented from time to time without notice and at the sole discretion of the Borough of Oakland.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that to the maximum extent permitted by law, employment practices for the Borough of Oakland shall operate under the legal doctrine known as "employment at will."
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Matthew J. Giacobbe of the firm of Cleary, Giacobbe, Alfieri, Jacobs LLC was as Labor Counsel for the Borough of Oakland to advise the Borough of Oakland in personnel matters.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Borough Administrator and all managerial/supervisory personnel are responsible for these employment practices. The Labor Attorney shall assist the Borough Administrator in the implementation of the policies and procedures in this manual.

RESOLUTION 18-311 AUTHORIZE AGNOLI ENGINEERING PHASE II RAMAPO RIVER PROJECT

Councilman Levy has been working with the DEP on getting the River Project underway. The DEP wants us to conduct a mussel survey. The season for the survey ends in September. The DEP agreed to extend this to the first week of October. This cannot wait until the next meeting due to the time sensitivity. This survey will determine how much work can be done in the river. Councilman Pignatelli asked if cancelling the former contract for the project cancel the project itself. Mr. Chewcaskie responded that the former contract was terminated because the contractor failed to act in a timely manner and the DEP did not issue the permit. Councilman Levy advised that this study must be done before any contract to do work in the river can be awarded. Mr. Chewcaskie reiterated that this study must be done in order to get a permit for the work to be done in the river. Councilman Levy explained that we will construct a design once we know how much work can be done in the river. Once we do the mussel study, it will be submitted to the DEP. We must mark the areas where the mussels are and there needs to be a 50 foot buffer. Councilman Pignatelli thought that we disagreed with the cost of the former study and this cost is higher. Mr. Kunze responded that the scope of the former study was insufficient. Councilman Levy explained that this study is being requested by the DEP. Councilman Pignatelli asked if we are going to use the boulders in the new project. Councilman Levy responded that the DEP is not happy with the boulders. The project will call for 4 to 6 ft. boulders. Councilman Pignatelli asked if there is an eventual benefit to the project. Councilman Levy responded it is for the health of the river as well as a fish habitat enhancement and there is some measure of flood control. Councilman Kulmala asked how much is budgeted for this. Mr. Kunze responded that the

balance of the soft costs was \$42,000 prior to the award of this contract. Councilman Kulmala asked what the expected project cost will be. Councilman Levy responded that his guesstimate would be \$250,000 to \$300,000 but we won't know for sure until the mussel study is done. Mr. Kunze advised that we have about \$480,000 for the project. Councilman Kulmala asked if someone can give the Council a presentation on this project after the study is done.

Councilman Talamini: There will be a meeting with school personnel on September 27th to discuss security. An Administration meeting was held yesterday to discuss the Building Department. The Public Events Committee will participate on September 30th with the Car Show. On October 14th, the Mothers' Club will have pumpkin painting at the Danny D'Elia Building. On October 13, they will particate with the Library Grand Opening. The Halloween Parade will be held on October 27th.

Councilman Kulmala: The Library Grand Opening will be held on October 13th at 11 am. He advised residents to come to the Library on Friday between 3 and 5 pm to say goodbye to Mr.

Ned. Councilman Kulmala attended the Fire One graduation last Thursday. He congratulated the graduates. Recreation fall sports are underway. They are getting ready for sign ups for winter sports. The Recreation Commission is adamant about having the bathrooms done. Mr. Kunze advised that we will go out to bid for the project in October. We are anticipating construction to occur over the winter in order to be ready for spring sports.

Councilman Biale: The Seniors will have bingo on October 18th. The Senior Flu Clinic will be held October 2nd and pre-registration will be held September 27th from 11 am to 1 pm. The Seniors will have a pizza party and play jeopardy on October 24th. The DPW is continuing compliance wit the Water Accountability Act by flushing valves and hydrants. The DPW is inspecting stormwater basins between October and November. Boswell Engineering is updating the water system map. The DPW is prepping the plows already in anticipation of the winter. Councilman Biale congratulated the Mayor. She is receiving the Attorney Community Service Award from the Bergen County Bar Association on October 4th. He congratulated the group he works for because they just received an award for the project in Franklin Lakes.

Councilman Pignatelli: He attended the Board of Health meeting. The Senior Flu shot clinic will be held October 2nd. There are over 30,000 people who die annually from the flu. Seniors and young children are susceptible. The rabies clinic will be held November 3rd from 1 to 3 pm at the Recreation shed. The Oakland Police Department provided traffic support for the P.S.E. & G. project. They completed mandated active shooter training. There are 150 hours mandated for firearms training. The Police Captain met with the schools and they did a monitored test of the panic buttons. The officers will walk through the schools starting in September. Officer McDonough will be on the road by himself by the beginning of October. Officers Martin and Fitzgerald are still in the Academy. The First Aid Squad had 70 calls in August which equated to 140 man hours. They have 628 calls for 1256 hours for the year-to-date. The Fire Department had 27 calls in August for 331 man hours. They have had 302 calls for 6406 man hours for the year-to-date.

Councilman Levy: The Flood Commission met and discussed the Army Corps review of the Flood project. We have work that needs to be done to maintain the project. The Flood Commission will need two new members in January. Councilman Levy did not attend the Shade Tree meeting. The Planning Board discussed the marijuana ordinance. They are looking at expanding the drug-free school zones.
