TITLE:

RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF APPLICATION FOR CLASS 1 CANNABIS CULTIVATION LICENSE IN THE BOROUGH OF OAKLAND

WHEREAS, pursuant to P.L. 2021, c. 16, known as the "New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory, Enforcement Assistance, and Marketplace Modernization Act" (the "Act"), which legalizes the recreational use of marijuana by adults 21 years of age or older, the Borough of Oakland ("Borough") adopted ordinance 22-Code-872, which allows for a limited number of cannabis businesses to be located in specific sections of the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Act established the Cannabis Regulatory Commission ("Commission") to oversee and regulate the cannabis industry in the State of New Jersey and the Commission promulgated Personal Use Cannabis Rules, N.J.A.C. 17:30-1.1 <u>et</u>. <u>seq</u>. on August 19, 2021; and

WHEREAS, in order for a cannabis business to operate, both State and Local approval are required; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 17:30-5.1 requires that a municipalities governing body express its support for a cannabis license applicant through a resolution of the governing body; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:30-5.1(g), the support resolution should indicate that the proposed cannabis business location is appropriately located or otherwise suitable for activities related to the operations of the proposed cannabis business; and

WHEREAS, the Borough's Cannabis License Application Evaluation Committee has received and reviewed the application submitted by Kusala Care, LLC. and has recommended that the Borough Council approve its application and adopt a resolution in support of their application for a State License;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Oakland, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey as follows:

- 1. The aforesaid recitals are incorporated herein as though fully set forth at length;
- 2. The Borough recognizes that Kusala Care, LLC. will be operating a Class I Cannabis Cultivation business involved in the cultivation of cannabis products and that the business location will be 27 Muller Road, Oakland, N.J. 07436 if approved by the State of New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory Commission;
- 3. Approving Kusala Care, LLC. application for a Class I Cannabis Business License would not exceed the limit established by the Borough for Class I Cannabis Cultivation licenses located in the Borough;
- 4. Kusala Care, LLC's proposed Class I Cannabis Cultivation Business use and location satisfy the Borough's Zoning and Cannabis Ordinances;
- 5. Kusala Care, LLC. shall continuously comply with the Borough's ordinances governing cannabis operations and any future applicable changes that may be made thereto;
- 6. If Kusala Care, LLC. is not in compliance at any time with the Borough's Cannabis Ordinances and any future applicable changes thereto, the Borough reserves the right to withdraw its support for their operations and suspend or revoke their local license;
- 7. The Borough approves Kusala Care, LLC's application submitted to the Borough and endorses Kusala Care, LLC's application to be submitted to the Commission for a Class I Cannabis Cultivation Business License at the location in the Borough as set forth above, which location is appropriate and suitable for a Class I Cannabis Cultivation License;
- 8. The Mayor, Borough Administrator, Borough Clerk, Borough Attorney, Chief Financial Officer, and any other necessary official, officer or employee of the Borough be and they are hereby authorized to execute any and all documents and to make any and all actions necessary to complete and realize the intent and purpose of this Resolution;
- 9. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

AUTHORIZE CELL TOWER CO-LOCATION AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, a Lease Agreement was entered into with Sprint Spectrum, LP, the predecessor in interest to SBA 2012 TC Assets, LLC ("SBA") on September 29, 2002 for the installation of wireless telecommunications facility at the Thornton Road Water Tank Site; and

WHEREAS, Paragraph 3 of the lease agreement provides for the collocation on the wireless telecommunications facility; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the terms of the Lease Agreement, fifty (50%) percent of any rent received by SBA for such collocation is to be paid to the Borough; and

WHEREAS, SBA has negotiated an agreement with Dish Wireless LLC; and

WHEREAS, such agreement provides for the payment of \$1,999.90 per month to SBA with a 2 percent annual increase; and

WHEREAS, SBA has requested that the Borough approve the agreement with Dish Wireless LLC for collocation on the Thornton Road Water Tank wireless telecommunications facility.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Oakland as follows:

- 1. The Supplement to the Master Lease Agreement entered into between SBA 2012 TC Assets, LLC and Dish Wireless LLC is hereby approved, subject to receipt of the sum of \$999.95 per month for such collocation pursuant to the lease agreement with SBA.
- 2. The additional rent to be received as a result of the Supplement to the Master Lease Agreement is to be paid by SBA with its monthly lease payments, subject to adjustment of 2 percent per year when effective.

ORDINANCE NO. 22-CODE-898

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF OAKLAND CHAPTER IX, RECREATION FACILITIES AND RECREATION AREAS, SUBCHAPTER 9-2.3, ENTITLED "FEE SCHEDULE FOR ACTIVITIES," AND SUBCHAPTER 9-2.4, ENTITLED "FEE AND PERMIT SCHEDULE FOR USE OF FIELDS AND ROLLER HOCKEY RINK" TO PROVIDE FOR THE USE OF FACILITIES AND THE FEE SCHEDULE THEREOF

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Oakland as follows:

Section 1. Chapter IX of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Oakland, Subchapter 9-2.3 Fee Schedule for Activities, be and the same, is hereby amended and supplemented in its entirety as follows:

Late Fees The Recreation Commission shall impose a late fee in the amount of thirty dollars (\$30.00) for any registration after the deadline established by the Commission for that particular recreational activity except for recreation and open camp.

Recreation Capital Improvement Fee (Cap Fee). All persons participating in the above recreation programs, in addition to registration fees set forth above, shall also pay the sum of eight dollars (\$8.00) per program, as indicated above, which shall be dedicated to capital and/or maintenance improvement of the recreation facilities. Said eight (\$8.00) dollar fee shall be segregated into a separate account for this purpose. If a participant plays recreation and travel for the same sport, only one (1) capital improvement fee should be paid. The capital improvement fee shall not apply to open camp registration, (but will apply to recreation and summer camp) or to activities that take place at non-borough facilities. Programs requiring payment of the Cap Fee are designated by an asterisk next to the fee.

Section 2. Chapter IX of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Oakland, Subchapter 9-2.4 "Fee and Permit Schedule for Use of Fields and Roller Hockey Rink", be and the same, is hereby amended and supplemented in its entirety as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 22-CODE-899

ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER XIII, SECTION 10 OF THE OAKLAND CODE, ENTITLED "FEE SCHEDULE" AND SECTION 13 ENTITLED "CHARGES AND FEES"

WHEREAS, the Borough of Oakland operates a water and sewer system as a municipal utility which must be self-sustaining; and

WHEREAS, the Water Quality Accountability Act requires purveyors to create and implement an asset management plan designed to inspect, maintain, repair, and renew its infrastructure consistent with standards established by the American Water Works Association. In addition, the Act also specifies a methodology for routinely testing of valves and fire hydrants; and

WHEREAS, compliance to the requirements of the Water Quality Accountability Act will generate increased operating and capital expenses; and

WHEREAS, increases in the costs of goods and services for the water utility due to inflation and increases in costs associated with labor and various other contracted services have increased overall operating and capital expenses for the utility; and

WHEREAS, in the event of revenue shortfalls, rates must be raised in order to keep the utility solvent;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Oakland as follows:

Section I. Chapter 13, Section 10.2 of the Borough of Oakland Code entitled "Minimum Charges" be and the same is hereby repealed and replaced with the following:

13-10.2 Minimum Charge.

Effective January 1, 2022 each customer shall pay a minimum charge of fifty-two dollars and zero (\$52.00) cents per quarter on the account, which charge shall entitle the customer to utilize up to six thousand (6,000) gallons of water. In the event that a customer commences or ceases to require services, during such portion of a quarter that it would be inequitable to charge the full minimum quarterly charge, the aforesaid amount shall be prorated as nearly as possible at the rate of sixteen dollars and sixty-six (\$17.33) cents which entitled the user to two thousand (2,000) gallons of water per month. In any event, any customer owning a home in Oakland for a minimum of one (1) year, using water supplied by the Borough, shall be required to pay a minimum of two hundred dollars and zero (\$208.00) cents per year.

Section II. Chapter 13, Section 10.3 of the Borough of Oakland Code entitled "Water and Sewer - Fee Schedule - Charges Over Minimum" be and the same is hereby repealed and replaced with the following:

13-10.3 Charges Over Minimum.

Effective January 1, 2022, customers who use in excess of six thousand (6,000) gallons per quarter shall pay, in addition to the minimum charge set forth in subsection 13-10.2, the sum of four dollars and five (\$4.05) cents for each one thousand (1,000) gallons used in a quarter above six thousand (6,000) gallons, up to ten thousand (10,000) gallons; the sum of five dollars and fourteen (\$5.14) cents for each one thousand gallons used in a quarter above ten thousand (10,000) gallons up to twenty-five thousand (25,000) gallons; the sum of five dollars and seventy (\$5.70) cent for each one thousand gallons used in a quarter above twenty-five thousand (25,000) gallons up to fifty thousand (50,000) gallons; and the sum of seven dollars and twenty-four (\$7.24) cents for each one thousand gallons used in a quarter above fifty thousand (50,000) gallons up to one hundred thousand (100,000) gallons. For each one thousand (1,000) gallons used in a quarter above one hundred thousand (100,000) gallons, the customer shall pay eight dollars and seventy-eight (\$8.78) cents per one thousand (1,000) gallons.

Section III. All other parts, portions and provisions of Chapter 13 of the Borough of Oakland Code be and the same are hereby ratified and confirmed, except where inconsistent with the terms hereof. In the event of any such inconsistency, the terms of this Ordinance shall be deemed to govern.

Section IV. The terms of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable; should any part, portion or provision hereof be declared invalid or unconstitutional, said finding shall not affect any other part, portion or provision thereof.

Section V. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication according to law.
