- Commission on the Life premium of 7.5% with payment being made to the Acrisure by the carrier.
- Commission on the Short Term Disability Premium of 10% to be paid directly by the carrier.
- Commission on the Long Term Disability premium of 15% to be paid directly by the carrier.

ORDINANCE NO. 24-CODE-943

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING RECREATION FACILITIES USAGE

WHEREAS, the Borough of Oakland had previously adopted certain ordinances related to use of restroom facilities; and

WHEREAS, the desires Borough amends this ordinance to more closely align with applicable state statutes

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Borough Council of Oakland as follows:

Section I. Chapter 9, Section 1.2(2) of the Borough of Oakland Code under "Prohibited Activities" is amended as follows:

Fail to cooperate in maintaining restrooms and washrooms in a neat and sanitary condition.

Section II. All other parts, portions and provisions of Chapter 9 of the Borough of Oakland Code be and the same are hereby ratified and confirmed, except where inconsistent with the terms hereof. In the event of any such inconsistency, the terms of this Ordinance shall be deemed to govern.

Section III. The terms of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable; should any part, portion or provision hereof be declared invalid or unconstitutional, said finding shall not affect any other part, portion or provision thereof.

Section IV. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication according to law.

CAPITAL ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF OAKLAND, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY AUTHORIZING THE MAKING OF VARIOUS PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS AND ACQUISITIONS IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH, APPROPRIATING THEREFOR THE SUM OF \$440,000.00 AND PROVIDING THAT SUCH SUM SO APPROPRIATED SHALL BE RAISED FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND OF THE BOROUGH.

<u>BE IT ORDAINED</u> by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Oakland, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey, as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> The Borough of Oakland, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey (the "Borough") is hereby authorized to make the following public improvements and acquisitions in, by and for the Borough, including all work, materials and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefor:

A. Fiber Optic Network purchase, installation and testing of equipment

Estimated Cost Total: \$103,000.00

B. <u>Network refresh for the Police Department with a VxRail with Horizon environment includes all licensing, hardware, end points, networking equipment, cables, programming and installation</u>

Estimated Cost Total: \$337,000.00

Section 2. The sum of \$440,000.00 is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of the improvements and acquisitions authorized and described in Section 1 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purpose"). Said appropriation shall be raised from the Capital Improvement Fund of the Borough. The sum of \$440,000.00 is hereby appropriated from the Capital Improvement Fund of the Borough to the payment of the cost of said purpose.

Section 3. Said improvements and acquisitions are lawful capital improvements of the Borough having a period of usefulness of at least five (5) years. Said improvements and acquisitions shall be made as general improvements, no part of the cost of which shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 4. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this capital ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect at the time and in the manner provided by law.

CAPITAL ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 2 OF THE CAPITAL ORDINANCE (ORD. NO. 22-885) ENTITLED: "CAPITAL ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF OAKLAND, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY AUTHORIZING THE MAKING OF VARIOUS PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS AND ACQUISITIONS IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH, APPROPRIATING THEREFOR THE SUM OF \$4,765,250 AND PROVIDING THAT SUCH SUM SO APPROPRIATED SHALL BE RAISED FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND OF THE BOROUGH - \$1,470,153, FROM THE GENERAL CAPITAL FUND BALANCE - \$400,000 AND FROM VARIOUS GRANTS - \$2,895,097," ADOPTED ON JUNE 8, 2022, AS PREVIOUSLY AMENDED BY CAPITAL ORDINANCE 22-897 ADOPTED ON 11/22/2022.

WHEREAS, THE Borough Council of the Borough of Oakland has heretofore authorized various improvements and acquisitions in, by and for the Borough and appropriated the aggregate sum of \$4,765,250 therefor pursuant to Ordinance No. 22-885 adopted by the Borough Council on June 8, 2022, as previously amended by Ordinance no 22-897 adopted on 11/22/2022 (collectively the "Prior Ordinance"); and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council now finds and determines that funding sources for the Prior Ordinance need to be amended,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Oakland, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey (the "Borough"), as follows:

Section 1. Section 2 of Ordinance 22-885 entitled, "CAPITAL ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF OAKLAND, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY AUTHORIZING THE MAKING OF VARIOUS PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS AND ACQUISITIONS IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH, APPROPRIATING THEREFOR THE SUM OF \$4,765,250 AND PROVIDING THAT SUCH SUM SO APPROPRIATED SHALL BE RAISED FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND OF THE BOROUGH -\$1,470,153, FROM THE GENERAL CAPITAL FUND BALANCE - \$400,000 AND FROM VARIOUS GRANTS -\$2,895,097," ADOPTED ON JUNE 8, 2022, AS PREVIOUSLY AMENDED BY CAPITAL ORDINANCE 22-897 ADOPTED ON 11/22/2022 (collectively the "Prior Ordinance") is hereby amended to (i) change the amount appropriated from the Capital Improvement Fund from \$1,230,153 to \$827,153 and(ii) change the amount appropriated from the Municipal Open Space Fund to \$643,000; and shall hereafter read as follows:

<u>Section 2</u>. The sum of \$4,765,250 is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of the improvements and acquisitions authorized and described in Section 1 hereof (hereinafter Said appropriation shall be raised from the Capital referred to as "purpose"). Improvement Fund, the General Capital Fund Balance of the Borough, the Municipal open Space Fund of the Borough and government grants. The sum of \$827,153 is hereby appropriated from the Capital Improvement Fund of the Borough, \$400,000 is hereby appropriated from the General Capital Fund Balance of the Borough and \$643,000 is hereby appropriated from the Municipal Open Space fund of the Borough to the payment of the cost of said purpose. The following government grants (aggregating to \$2,895,097) received or to be received by the Borough are hereby appropriated as follows: (A) \$1,352,000 from the Federal Government's American Recovery Plan Act to finance the cost of the Streets and Road Program described in Section 1.D hereof; (B) \$27,347 from the Bergen County Historic Preservation Grant program to finance the costs of the Van Allen House Interior described in Section 1.E hereof; (C) \$1,228,750 from the Bergen County Flood Plain Acquisition Grant program to finance the costs of the Flood Buyouts -Phase 3 Lenape Lane described in Section 1.E hereof; (D) \$87,000 from the Bergen County Park Improvement Grant program to finance the costs of Roosevelt Park Improvements described in Section 1.E hereof; and (E) \$200,000 from the Bergen County Park

Improvement Grant program to finance the costs of Truman Field Improvements described in Section 1.E hereof.

<u>Section 2.</u> Said improvement is a lawful capital improvement of the Borough having a period of usefulness of at least five (5) years. Said improvement shall be made as a general improvement, no part of the cost of which shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 3. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this capital ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

<u>Section 4.</u> This ordinance shall take effect at the time and in the manner provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 24-CODE-942

"AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND, SUPPLEMENT AND REVISE THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF OAKLAND, and CHAPTER 2 ENTITLED "ADMINISTRATION" BY ESTABLISHING A RECREATION COMMITTEE"

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Oakland, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey that Chapter 2, Section 7.7 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough Oakland, be repealed and replaced with the following:

SECTION 1:

a.

Composition. A Recreation Committee in the Borough is hereby established which shall consist of seven regular members who are citizens and residents of the Borough and two alternate members who are citizens and residents of the Borough.

h.

Members Appointed. The members of the Recreation Committee shall be appointed by the Mayor.

c.

Term of Office. All appointments for regular members and alternate members shall be for a period of five years and until their respective successors are appointed and shall qualify. All vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term only.

d.

No Salaries for Member's Services. The members of the Recreation Committee shall receive no salary or other compensation for their services.

e.

Purpose. The purpose of the Recreation Committee is to help meet the social and recreational needs of the community by developing and running a wide variety of sports programs and activities and by working to improve the Borough's parks and recreational facilities.

f.

Committee Procedures. Upon the appointment of the members of the Recreation Committee, the Committee shall organize and elect such officers and adopt such rules and regulations, subject to approval of the Governing Body, as the Committee may deem necessary for the faithful discharge of its duties and for the proper exercise of the powers.

Control of Facilities. The Recreation Committee shall adopt suitable rules, regulations and bylaws for the use of all lands, playgrounds and recreation places, and the conduct of all persons while on or using the same, subject to approval of the Governing Body. Any person who shall violate any such rules, regulations or bylaws shall be deemed and adjudged to be a disorderly person.

h Employees. The Recreation Committee may appoint a Secretary or Clerk and such number of camp staff and assistants for the several playgrounds and recreation places under its control as they shall think necessary and proper and shall fix and determine their respective salaries in accordance with the Salary Ordinance of the Borough, subject to the approval of the Mayor and Council of the Borough.

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Annual Report. The Recreation Committee shall make an annual written report on or before the first day of February of each year and transmit the same to the Mayor and Council of the Borough. The annual written report shall contain an itemized accounting of all activities, receipts, disbursements, expenditures and number of employees for the full year.

i.

Authorization to Establish Fees for Use of Facilities. The Recreation Committee, in conjunction with Borough Administration, shall have the power to recommend certain fees to be charged for participation in the Committee's programs and activities and to those entities who desire to use the various recreation facilities in the Borough under the control of the Recreation Committee. Such fees shall be considered by the Mayor and Council, and incorporated into the Ordinance which establishes recreation fees. Such fees, once established, shall immediately be posted in the Borough Hall and published in the official newspaper.

k.

Collection of Fees. It shall be the responsibility of the Recreation Committee to collect the fees charged by the Recreation and to promptly deliver such fees to the Borough Treasurer for deposit in segregated trust accounts relating to the Recreation Committee. Capital & Field Use Fees charged for use of the recreation fields and/or properties shall be deposited in a separate trust account, the purpose of which shall be to aid in the maintenance of such fields and grounds. The fees that are generated for sports participation shall be deposited in a separate Trust account for the purpose of running the sports/recreation programs.

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Expenditure of Fees. Expenditures by the Recreation Committee of any of the fees collected by the Recreation Committee may only be made pursuant to applicable state and local procurement rules and regulations.

SECTION 2:

All Ordinances of the Borough of Oakland which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 3:

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4:

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage, approval and publication as required by law.
